Overview



For over 13 years the Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival (HMK Children's Water Festival or HMKCWF) has been an event which actively inspires and teaches elementary students about water ecology and stewardship in their homes, classrooms, and communities. Since 2005, thousands of children and their teachers have attended a 'day camp' annual event to learn about the valuable natural resource, water. Children have fun while engaging in experiential learning, visiting 40-50 interactive, hands-on activity stations where they learn about all things water, while making ecological connections to the natural world around them. In more recent years we have developed new climate change related activities and a Water Heroes website (waterheroes.ca) encouraging stewardship in follow-up to the festival.

Due to COVID-19 health and safety measures, the HMKCWF could not deliver inperson festivals in 2020-21. In lieu of this, "Water Week: In-Class Modules for Teachers" was created and shared. This resource provides informational

guidance and lesson plans for classes to learn experientially through activities on school grounds. HMKCWF's goal for 2022 is to further adapt and deliver quality experiential, outdoor water stewardship education to the youth of our region, broaden our outreach, all while respecting the updated health and safety measures. If we can pool the resources, HMKCWF will partner with libraries and municipalities, to offer a series of self-guided, outdoor 'water storybook walks' for families, students, and youth groups. We will adapt our activity centres and storage to develop a carbon-emission sensitive transportation and delivery plan for two kinds of supported 'mobile festival' kits; those that can be used on school grounds for multiple classes and for families and groups at local shorelines and community events. We will update our Water Heroes website and program to reach more young people to inform and encourage their water stewardship acts more regularly through the year. In collaboration with partners and respecting evolving pandemic protocols, we will host outdoor Water Festivals with smaller groups at multiple community events, within school grounds and as a day-camp with school groups.

The Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival has been offering this unique programming without charge since 2005. Please help us adapt and sustain these important opportunities for our children and communities to become local Water Heroes.

Our outreach is broad and thus the exposure of your businesses' support will be expansive!

Our Children's Water Festival provides programs for and reaches out to youth of Haliburton, Muskoka and Kawartha Lakes regions (combined populations of 155,000+). With our partner, Trillium Lakelands District School Board (TLDSB), we reach 41 elementary school communities and have hosted more than a thousand students in peak years at our fall festival day-camp events. Our "Water Heroes" program, our websites, and our support packages for teachers have reached youth and families well beyond those who attend festival events and our region (90,000+ unique visitors). Over 250 volunteers have supported our educational programs annually, including Trent University students, Fleming College students (Lindsay campus) as well as secondary-school students. Our 2022 program trials are based in locations in all 3 municipal regions of the TLDSB including, but not limited to, Haliburton, Minden Hills, City of Kawartha Lakes, Huntsville, Gravenhurst and various shoreline locations with partnering lake and conservation associations. We are based in the territories of and support the stewardship of the Anishinabewaki, Algonquin, Wendake-Nionwentsio, Mississauga, and Haudenosaunee peoples.

The Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival is the flagship project of the charitable organization, Friends of Ecological and Environmental Learning (FEEL). The mandate of Friends of Ecological and Environmental Learning is to advance the public's awareness, understanding and appreciation of ecosystems through education.

The HMKCWF steering committee is made up 5-10 representatives of supporting organizations and other interested individuals from the community advising the coordinating contractors. Advisors join together 10-25 program delivery partners in our supportive

communities, including but not limited to: Kinark Outdoor Centre, U-Links Centre for Community-Based Research, Township of Minden Hills, Municipality of Bancroft, regional libraries, Trent University, Sir Sanford Fleming College, Abbey Gardens, Minden Agriculture Association, Ministry of Natural Resources and Forests, Ministry of Environment and Climate Change, Muskoka Watershed Council and TRACKS (Trent Aboriginal Cultural Knowledge and Science).
